Status:

- -During Cycle 3, SJC reviewed the previous Letter of Intent, sent out a survey to staff to determine current understanding regarding equity needs, and assessed how this work could fit alongside the established robust monthly heritage work.
- -Drafted a plan for all Nishuane learners to engage with Bree Picower's Six Elements of Social Justice before they move to 3rd grade; 2nd graders will end their time at Nish participating in a social action
- -Currently drafting the MFEE Equity Grant application to serve grades Pre-K through 2nd grade for 2023-2024 school year:
 - Grant will pay for a classroom set of 4-5 books used to introduce and reinforce the standards
 - Lesson plans will be drafted to focus on the standards during the last week of the month
 - We will work to gain support from Bree Piocower's interns to help our teachers explore the Six Elements of Social
 Justice throughout the school year and possibly have them present to parents
